Easter, also called Pascha or Resurrection Sunday is a celebrated Christian festival.

Easter revolves around the Resurrection of Jesus Christ—three days after his crucifixion, death, and burial.

Today, this spiritually meaningful date is commonly associated with the friendly Easter Bunny and the eggs it hides.

Should we celebrate Easter or allow our children to go on Easter egg hunts? This is a question both parents and church leaders struggle with. Ultimately, it comes down to a matter of conscience Romans 14:5.

There is nothing essentially evil about painting and hiding eggs and having children search for them, they can be taught to understand that the eggs are just a fun game.

What is important is our focus about what Christ Jesus did on our behalf and our Children come to know the true meaning of the day.

Easter signifies the triumph of Jesus over death. Christians believe that the resurrection of The Bible makes it clear that Jesus was resurrected on the first day of the week, Sunday Matthew 28:1; Mark 16:2,9; Luke 24:1; John 20:1,19).



Jesus confirmed that he was the Son of God who had come to Earth to provide salvation to humankind and redeem us of our sins through his compassionate sacrifice. Matthew 12:40 Christians celebrate Easter as the resurrection of Christ on the third day after His crucifixion.

Easter is the oldest Christian holiday and the most important day of the church year because of the significance of the crucifixion and resurrection of Jesus Christ, the events upon which Christianity is based 1 Corinthians 15:14.

The resurrection likewise marks Christ out as the one and only redeemer and the one means of access to God. John 2:19-22, John 14:6

It authenticates His own claims that He was the way, the truth, and the life, and that He came to give His life a ransom for many. Matthew 16:21, Romans 4:25, 5:1, Acts 4:12

What happens when we share the good news of Christ Jesus resurrection? Acts 4:1-10
