

Essential assurance of salvation: Romans 1:16

It is clear of what was accomplished by Jesus Christ after dying on the cross?
(John 19:28-30, John 18:11-14, Galatians 5:13-18, 1st Peter 1:18-20)

1) Assurance of salvation comes just as soon as he/she meets the condition of trusting in Christ Jesus as their personal Savior:

- a) A new sense of sinfulness of sin (John 3:5, Titus 3:5-6)
- b) A new love for the unsaved (2nd Corinthians 5:14-15,19)
- c) A new love for the Saved (1st John 3:14)

2) Salvation is a gift which cannot be earned:

- God's grace Ephesians (2:5, 8) God's Love Romans (5:8)
- God's mercy (Titus 3:5) Christ alone (Acts 4:12)
- The cross (1st Corinthians 1:18)

3) Some of the requirements for Salvation:

- a) Confession (Acts 2:21)
- b) Repentance (1John 1:9)
- c) Faith (Hebrews 11:6)
- d) Regeneration (John 3:3)

4) Confidence that the Bible (Word of God) is true: (1John 5:13)
