**Question** what is wisdom to you? It is a comprehensive insight into how God view things.

The Bible urges us often to seek wisdom above all things, Proverbs 2:3-6. Proverbs 4:7

Jesus chose twelve ordinary men who needed to be taught all about Godly wisdom. Matthew 28:17-19, John 14:18, Acts 1:6-8

<u>Godly wisdom</u> teaches us to be careful of judging others. <u>Matthew 7:1-5, Romans 3:23, Isaiah 1;18-19</u>

<u>Godly wisdom</u> may look very different from worldly wisdom. Jesus highlighted these differences in His Sermon on the Mount Matthew 5—7.

We can only live in godly wisdom when we are committed to crucifying our flesh and living in the Spirit Galatians 2:20; Ephesians 5:16, 25).

<u>Godly wisdom</u> teaches the believer we are to follow in Jesus' steps <u>1 Peter 2:21</u>, <u>1 Corinthians 11:1</u>

Scripture advise us to look to Christ as our example <u>John 13:15</u>; <u>Romans 15:7</u>; <u>1 Corinthians 11:1</u>; <u>Ephesians 4:32</u>; <u>5:25</u>

To help guide our <u>decisions</u> in life. we should ask ourselves, "What would Jesus do when facing certain situations. <u>James 1:2-3</u>

First, we must make sure that our answer to the question "What would Jesus do?" is based on the objective truth of Scripture and not subjective opinion. <u>John 6:32-35</u>, <u>John 8:32</u>,

We cannot really know what Jesus would do if we do not know what Jesus did do. John 15:7

Jesus was always willing to use Godly wisdom. John 5: 30, John 8: 29

For example, if we are faced with the choice of showing compassion versus ignoring a need, we can look to Jesus' behavior in the Gospels Matthew 14:14.
